Road Dangers and Obstacles

The Peninsula Pedallers Committee has decided that because our members often notice potentially dangerous objects, obstacles and other dangers whilst riding, that we would collect such information and direct it to the relevant authorities, such as local councils and Vic Roads.

Obviously, we are only concerned about conditions of significant danger to cyclists, such as fallen trees, major potholes, loose surfaces and the like, and not trivial annoyances.

In the first instance, you are encouraged to identify the relevant local Council then make direct contact to report the issue. Most Councils can be directly approached by telephone or via their website or personal visit. Many are also using an App. for mobile phones that can include an on-site photo.

Our committee member Ian Stevenson has kindly offered to act as our liaison person to pass on any such issues with roads that seem be hazardous or need of some repair.
